

Clinical Fellowship in Adult Cardiac Surgery

The Division of Cardiac Surgery, Queen's University offers a one-year clinical fellowship for graduate Cardiac Surgeons interested in expanding the scope and breadth of their clinical experience in adult cardiac surgery. Start date is July 1, 2019.

The Division of Cardiac Surgery, Queen's University comprises four surgeons and conducts 625 procedures per year including 50 TAVI. With the exception of VAD/transplant, all facets of Cardiac Surgery are undertaken, including minimally invasive valve surgeries and thoracic aortic reconstruction. The Division also constitutes a strong presence in the post-operative CV-ICU. We enjoy an excellent collegial relationship with local and regional cardiology colleagues. The Division embodies a strong sense of teamwork amongst its members and allied health professionals.

The successful candidate will be encouraged to actively participate in O.R., CV-ICU, and outpatient clinic activities conducted by the Division. In addition, there will be a 1:4 on-call rotation. Research activity is strongly encouraged under the guidance of the Divisional Research Co-ordinator.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Completion of Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada accredited residency program (or equivalent) in Cardiac Surgery.
2. In possession of, or eligible for, independent practice or educational license with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO).
3. Proficiency in spoken and written English
4. Queen's University is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and invites applications from all qualified individuals. Canadian citizens or permanent residents will be given priority.
