INTERVENTIONAL CARDIOLOGIST: Clinical Assistant Professor, UBC Department of Medicine, Division of Cardiology, Vancouver, British Columbia

The UBC Division of Cardiology invites applications from outstanding Interventional Cardiologists with a special expertise in complex coronary interventions and an academic focus on Health Outcomes Research, New Device Development, and Innovative Bench Testing for a full-time position at the rank of Clinical Assistant Professor. This position is based at both Vancouver General and St. Paul's Hospital, with a major academic commitment to work closely with both the Centre for Heart Valve Innovation and the BC Center for Improved Cardiovascular Health. All sites are University of British Columbia affiliated teaching hospitals.

The Division of Cardiology is actively involved in the care of patients with a wide spectrum of cardiovascular disease in the Lower Mainland (Fraser Health, Providence Health Care, Provincial Health Services Authority, and Vancouver Coastal Health) and the Province of BC and Yukon. The Division is seeking an individual with formal training in complex coronary interventions, including percutaneous management of chronic total occlusions, to meet the needs of its patients in this emerging discipline. Applicants must have specific interest and formal training in research methodology with a Health Outcomes focus, including an advanced research degree, preferably a Master's in Public Health. The successful applicant will have had extensive experience in all aspects of new device development, including innovative hemodynamic and wear testing for new cardiovascular devices. The successful applicant will be expected to participate in teaching and research related to health outcomes and new device development, including potential participation in formal and informal teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate trainees. The successful applicant will have an important clinical role in the Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory at Vancouver General and St. Paul's Hospital. Academic expectations include 50% protected time for research and teaching. Incremental academic skills will be looked upon favorably to enhance the UBC Division. The Division operates an academic partnership plan, which the successful candidate is expected to contribute to, and be eligible to receive a supplementary stipend for exceptional academic contribution.

The successful candidate will possess an FRCPC in Internal Medicine and a Certificate of Special Competence in Cardiology, or its equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure in the Province of British Columbia. Candidates should possess exceptional communication and teaching skills. As part of UBC Cardiology's academic focus the successful candidate will be expected to substantially support the development and growth of the UBC Cardiology research and teaching program.

UBC hires on the basis of merit and is strongly committed to equity and diversity within its community. We especially welcome applications from visible minority group members, women, Aboriginal persons, persons with disabilities, persons of minority sexual orientations and gender identities, and others with the skills and knowledge to productively engage with diverse communities. Canadian and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

The anticipated start date is July 2019. Applications will be accepted until April 6, 2019, with review of the applications shortly thereafter, and will continue until the position is filled.
