

The Department of Pediatrics at McMaster University and McMaster Children's Hospital are seeking **one full-time academic physician** to join the Division of Pediatric Cardiology. The successful candidate will be considered a Clinician Educator and will be expected to share responsibility for education and research within the division, as well as comprehensive clinical services. They will also be required to participate in outreach clinics and teaching. The Pediatric Cardiology Division at McMaster is an inpatient and outpatient service that functions as a tertiary care referral centre for the regions of Waterloo-Wellington and Hamilton-Niagara-Haldimand-Brant (LHIN's 3 and 4) serving a community of 2.3 million people. The successful candidate must have experience in management of children with complex cardiac anomalies, fetal cardiology, pediatric echocardiography and research. Additional expertise in clinical pediatric cardiology sub-specialties will be considered an asset, with the exception of surgical and interventional subspecialties, as McMaster Children's Hospital is not a cardiac surgical center.

This position will incorporate an academic appointment and salary will be commensurate with the experience and expertise of the applicant. The Division of Pediatric Cardiology currently consists of 6 pediatric cardiologists with a wide range of clinical, academic and research interests. We offer a collegial atmosphere, a unique academic environment, many research opportunities and the opportunity to work in a growing academic department with enthusiastic colleagues. McMaster University is internationally recognized for innovations in medical education and pioneering biomedical, epidemiological and health systems research. We are looking to further contribute to the ongoing research with innovative pediatric cardiology clinical research initiatives.

Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Pediatric Cardiology and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada - or - No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada. If the candidate's status changes throughout the selection process, they are welcome to update our selection committee accordingly.
